To: People Interested in the Lolo Creek Permanent Weir Fish Trapping Facility

In October of 2011 the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) in cooperation with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) started the process of assessing the potential environmental impacts of the proposed replacement of the Lolo Creek weir in Lolo Creek, near the town of Weippe, in Clearwater County, Idaho. A Preliminary Environmental Assessment (PEA) has recently been drafted and BPA invites you to comment on the proposed project. This letter contains information about the project and describes how you can comment on the proposal.

Background:

BPA is proposing to fund the replacement of the existing 10-year old seasonal fish weir on Lolo Creek with a permanent weir designed to operate safely over a range of different stream flows. Due to icing in the winter and high flows in the spring, the existing seasonal weir is not effective or safe to use during the time when adult steelhead are returning to Lolo Creek to spawn. The weir is used to monitor federally-listed Snake River steelhead and for the collection of spring Chinook salmon adults to support on-going hatchery programs in the watershed. After construction of the new weir, the Nez Perce Tribe (NPT) will continue to operate and maintain the facility. The BLM has granted the NPT a formal 'right-of-way;' so the Tribe can cross BLM land to access the weir. For more information on the project, go to www.bpa.gov/go/lolocreekweir.

Environmental Assessment:

BPA in cooperation with the BLM, has prepared a Preliminary Environmental Assessment that describes the potential environmental impacts of the proposed project and the no action alternative. The PEA also provides an assessment of the impacts to floodplains and wetlands potentially affected by the project as well as a Wild and Scenic River Analysis, pursuant to Section 7 of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act. This letter invites you to comment on the PEA and includes information on how to submit your comments.
