<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund the Kalispel Tribe to purchase Indian Creek Slope, a 30-acre parcel of land located approximately eight miles northwest of Newport, Washington, and 55 miles north of Spokane, Washington, in Pend Oreille County, Washington. BPA would hold a conservation easement to permanently protect, mitigate, and enhance fish and wildlife and their habitat.

Funding the purchase of the property would serve as partial mitigation for the construction and operation of the Federal Columbia River Power System which includes dams on the main stem Columbia and Snake Rivers. This land purchase would specifically satisfy some of BPA's commitments made in the Memorandum of Understanding between the Kalispel Tribe of Indians and the Bonneville Power Administration.

The property consists of mixed conifer forest habitat. The Kalispel Tribe would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the conservation easement and the purpose of the acquisition. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

Categorical Exclusion Environmental Checklist

Project Site Description

The 30-acre Indian Creek Slope site is comprised of mixed upland coniferous forest and lies approximately one mile north of the Pend Oreille River and 0.6 miles east of Indian Creek, and is located approximately eight miles northwest of Newport, WA, and 55 miles north of Spokane, WA. It is accessed via Indian Creek Road which serves as the northern property boundary. Land uses within the area are primarily timber cultivation and agriculture with some residential. The subject property is zoned Natural Resource 20 - it is used primarily for light recreation. Past practices included timber harvesting but there is currently little evidence of disturbance on the property. The property hosts white-tailed deer and bald eagle; any ESA-listed species present would be considered an infrequent transient visitor.
