Dear Ms. Eberling:

This communication is the Bonneville Power Administration's (BPA) final response to your request for agency records and information made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). Your records request was received on March 23, 2018. Your records request was acknowledged on April 6, 2018. Your records request was responded to and further amended as described below.

March 23, 2018 Request

"[Records related to or showing]... how much funding BPA provides to NOAA's science, research or for any other reasons you might describe (including the ESA)... [and]... who/what department(s) in NOAA [are] being funded by BPA..."

March 27, 2018 Responsive Public Information Provided

The agency sent you the Internet link <u>www.cbfish.org</u>, via email, containing responsive publicly available information.

March 27, 2018 Clarification

"[Information]...for the years 1998-2018 (or as current as possible due to fiscal year timing). A responsive document should be sufficient."

April 5, 2018 Clarification (superseding the date range requested in the March 27, 2018

Clarification)

"[Information for]...the years 2012 [to] current would be sufficient."

April 16, 2018 Responsive Public Information Provided

Further in the agency's ongoing response to your FOIA request, the agency's Natural Resources desk offered that, at the Internet link <u>www.cbfish.org</u>, the Interactive Map and Report on spending by entity was partly responsive to your FOIA request. Also, Figure 10 in the previously provided and publicly available 16th Annual Report to the Northwest Governors Annual Cost Report (which the Northwest Power and Conservation Council prepares with data provided by BPA) provided you with responsive information:

You submitted these follow-up inquiries to the agency (edited for brevity):

- 4. Also, the chart labels these as "contracts." Are these binding contracts?
- 5. Does BPA require a non-disclosure agreement with these agencies?

Response

Responsive to your FOIA request, the agency's Fish & Wildlife office has generated a report showing all expenditures for NOAA Fisheries during the fiscal years 2012 through 2017, by project. That responsive report, NOAA Contract Expenditures Fiscal Years 2012-2017 (1 page), accompanies this communication.

Responsive to your enumerated questions, above, the agency's Fish & Wildlife office has generated the following information and reports:

1. Did all the money shown on the charts go directly to the science center/funding?

No, BPA funding for the Science Center goes through NOAA Fisheries. We have various contracts with NOAA Fisheries, but the Science Center is not necessarily involved in each project. That responsive report, "FY16 NOAA contracts (2 pages)," accompanies this communication and provides a list of 31 active contracts during fiscal year 2016.

2. Can BPA provide specifics on where the money went?

This information is found on a report accompanying this communication ("Direct Program Expenditures of FCRPS BiOp Projects, FY2016 (4 Pages)"). Statements of Work for each project show the budgets assigned to each work element. Actual costs that BPA reimbursed to the NOAA Fisheries (which may be less than the amount budgeted) are listed on the report under Question 1. If this question refers to all FCRPS spending, see page 10 of the Northwest Council's Governors Report.

3. Can BPA release the specifics on the identities of "private/non-profit/other" groups, as shown on "Contractor Costs FY2016"?

Yes, the names of all of BPA's fish and wildlife mitigation contractors are public and found within the website <u>www.cbfish.org</u>. BPA has also prepared a report showing this information ("Direct Program Expenditures by Contractor Type, FY2016 (4 Pages)"), and it accompanies this communication.

4. Also, the chart labels these as "contracts." Are these binding contracts?

Yes, contracts are legally binding procurement contracts administered following the BPA

Purchasing Instructions. BPA does not use the Federal Acquisition Regulations used by most agencies. BPA uses contracts when funding goods and services needed by the agency, and uses either contracts or financial assistance agreements (grants) to fund other types of work, including Fish and Wildlife projects.

5. Does BPA require a non-disclosure agreement with these agencies?

In accord with the FOIA, BPA is herein releasing 11 pages of responsive agency records/reports, as described above, with no redactions applied.

Your FOIA request is now closed with all available agency records and information provided. Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.7(b)(2), I am the individual responsible for the release and determinations described above.

Appeal

This decision, as well as the adequacy of the search, may be appealed within 90 calendar days from your receipt of this letter pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8. Appeals should be addressed to:

The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA appeal is being made. You may also submit your appeal to <u>OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov</u>, including the phrase "Freedom of Information Appeal" in the subject line. The appeal must contain all of the elements required by 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8, including a copy of the determination letter. Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either: 1) in the

district where you reside; 2) where you have your principal place of business; 3) where DOE's records are situated; or 4) in the District of Columbia.
