I, UM. A. FEARL, Bosseville Power Administrator, under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of Congress approved February 25, 1931 (46 Stat. 1481; b) U.S.C., 1958 ed., sec. 250a), do hereby make and file this Declaration of Taking and do hereby state and declare:

1. The Act of Congress approved August 20, 1957 (50 Stet. 731; 16 U.S.C., 1936 ed., ch. 128), as amended, together with Public Works Appropriation Act, 1960, exected September 10, 1999, the Act of Conareas approved June 20, 1949 (63 Stat. 203; 5 U.S.C., 1958 ed., sec. 1372). Recreation tion No. 3 of 1950 (15 F.R. 3174), Order No. 2563 of the Segretary of the Interior (15 F.R. 3193), and Order No. 2753 of the Secretary of the Interior, as assaided (23 F.R. 9709), sutherizes se, in the same of the United States of America, to acquire the land, the perpetual examents and the right to fell, limb or top danger trees described in the condemnation complaint in the above extitled proceeding and described and set forth hereinbelow. The said Act of August 20, 1917, as exceeded, and the Act of Congress approved August 1, 1886 (25 Stat. 357; 40 U.S.G., 1958 ed., sec. 257), as amended, authorize the United States to acquire the land, the perpetual cosecents and right to fell, limb or top danger trees by confermation.
