New multifamily ductless heat pump measures available April 1

Effective April 1, BPA will be adding new UES measures to the Implementation Manual for Multifamily Ductless Heat Pump (DHP) installations. Qualifying DHPs for standard income multifamily applications will be \$800/unit and low-income multifamily ductless heat pumps will be \$6,000/unit. All other existing efficiency and documentation requirements will remain the same.

Low-income custom project payment rate to increase

Effective April 1, BPA will be increasing the low-income payment rate for custom projects in residential applications to \$5.00/kWh. BPA's willingness to pay for low-income custom projects will continue to be the lesser of the (1) payment rate or (2) 70 percent of project cost. Please refer to IM Section 11.9 for low income custom project qualifying guidelines. Join us for the April IM updates webinar on March 31 for more details.

Reporting deadline reminder for expired UES measures

Per <u>Implementation Manual Section 3.2, Reporting Requirements</u>, if a UES measure expires, customers must submit the measure for compliance review within six months of the expiration date. In order to qualify for payment, measures which expired September 30, 2023 must be invoiced by March 31, 2024. Please reach out to your EER if you have any questions.

Trade Ally Network NW: Support for commercial lighting projects

BPA has updated the Trade Ally Network NW <u>marketing toolkit for TLEDs</u>. Updates reflect the recent increase in BPA's willingness to pay for TLED projects that replace or bypass the existing fluorescent ballasts (i.e., \$8/tube for Type B/C tubes). <u>Nonresidential Lighting</u> <u>Calculator v6.0</u> reflects this as the default incentive. Promoting these higher incentives to installers and business owners is a critical step in maximizing participation in your commercial lighting program.
