#### General IM

#### 6.2 Distribution Channels – By Request

- Eligible items that the utility or its agent provided to end-users at their upon the request of the consumer. Items are provided to consumers either through the mail or by direct distribution (such as at a county fair). By Request channel applies to items given to consumers end-users in a number of circumstances, such as:
- Over the counter in the utility office;
- Given directly to the consumer Left behind at end-user's home after utility program sponsored work such as home energy audit, weatherization, or door-to-door campaign, etc. (Leaving on a doorstep or with an apartment manager etc. is not sufficient.)
- At events (such as county fairs or an annual utility meeting);
- End user Consumer redemption of a utility coupon or postcard for a free item; or
- Reimbursing the end-user consumer for a qualified purchase. By Request measures may be fulfilled through a utility-run program or a BPA program; eligible items distributed through a BPA program will have separate reference numbers.

#### 6.2 Distribution Channels - Direct Install

- Eligible items that the utility or its agent provide and install for the end-user consumer at no cost. Direct Install measures must be
  - (1) installed by a utility customer or their agent; or
  - (2) installed by a third-party (e.g., an apartment complex maintenance manager) and witnessed by the utility customer or their agent. or
  - (3) the utility customer or their agent visually inspects a representative sample after installation by a third-party. Direct install measures may be fulfilled through a utility program or a BPA program. All eligible items distributed through a BPA program will have separate reference numbers.


#### **New Calculators**

8.3.1 Nonresidential Lighting Calculators

BPA is developing an Online Lighting Calculator (OLC) to replace the current BPA Lighting Calculator Series 6 (Nonresidential Lighting Calculator V6.0.) The OLC will launch in FY 2025 and BPA will communicate a transition date and training plan when the "go live" date is confirmed.

- □ 10.3.3 Performance Tracking System corrected the 'Basis for Energy Savings' and 'Payment' sections to clarify the customers' ability to divide PTS initial installation and setup payments into multiple phases within a two-year performance period. Updated the 'Additional Information' section stating the optional Performance Tracking System Calculator can be used to help customers track PTS payments when separated into phases.
- □ 10.4.1 Variable Frequency Drives for Fans in Potato and Onion Storage Facilities corrected the 'Payment' section to clarify the payment and energy savings is based on specific VFD horsepower that is available in the UES Measure List; note the payment amount still equates to \$200 per horsepower.

□ 10.4.4 Noted the expiration of the Green Motors Rewind Initiative (effective September 30, 2024) – the vendor of the BPA-funded, third-party-operated program no longer provides this service.

  - Removed requirement "A maximum of one unitary HPWH measure may be claimed per home."
- 11.4.4 Split-System Heat Pump Water Heater
  - Removed requirement "A maximum of one unitary HPWH measure may be claimed per home."
